PART 02 / INSTALLATION

Choose where the skill should live

Claude Code discovers a skill from a folder containing SKILL.md. Use a personal location when the manual should be available across projects, or keep it inside one project repository when it belongs to that project only.

01 Create the skill folder

Personal on Windows:

`%USERPROFILE%\ .claude\skills\section-purpose-check\`

Personal on macOS or Linux: `~/.claude/skills/section-purpose-check/`

Project: `.claude/skills/section-purpose-check/`

02 Save the prompt

Create SKILL.md inside that folder and paste only the complete prompt from Part 01.

Keep the YAML markers at the top of the file.

03 Let Claude discover it

Claude Code watches existing skill directories for changes. If you create a new top-level skills directory during an active session, restart Claude Code so that directory is watched.

04 Invoke the skill

Ask a matching question and let Claude select it, or run `/section-purpose-check` directly while reviewing a real website page.

PART 03 / VERIFICATION

Test it on a real page

A skill is installed when Claude can discover it, invoke it and return the required structure. Test behaviour rather than assuming that the file location is correct.

01 Run a direct check

Open Claude Code inside a website project and run `/section-purpose-check`. Provide the page path or paste a short page outline.

02 Check the output

Require a page purpose, section audit table, revised order, evidence requests, mobile notes and removal list. Missing facts must remain marked as client input, not filled with plausible copy.

03 Try automatic matching

Ask: 'This landing page feels long and repetitive. Which sections should stay?' Claude should recognise the description and apply the skill without the slash command.

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
